



Homer as a Jewish Princess, Niqia

This puts her in the range of when she wrote the Iliad and the Odyssey. Homer was thought to have come from an island off the coast of Naples, Italy. We know there were Jews in the Kingdom of Naples who were expelled in 1533. The Adolcenti were descendants of the Jews of Judaea, Niqia's royal tribe.
