## Abstract

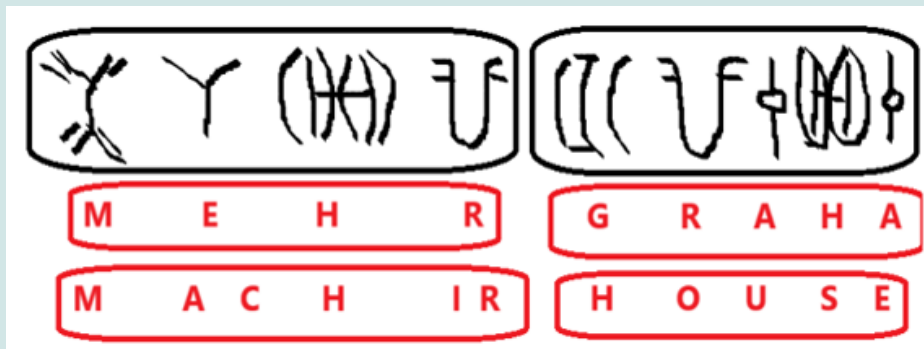


Figure 1: Mehrgrah 7000-5500BCE aceramic Neolithic.

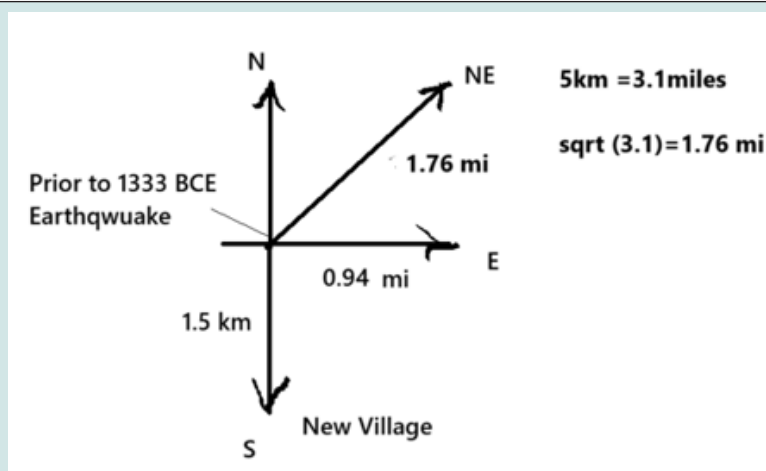
