b. c. If the misunderstanding or the risk of submersion/overcoming of the father can rarely reach the search for an escape: running away vs. abandoning the home or violent acts that can go as far as filicide or parricide.

d. Conflicts could reach extremes, leading to recourse to infamy or parricide. Antiquity shows many exemplary cases, such as the ideas of elimination of ALEXANDRE by his father PHILIP of MACEDON, after his remarriage and the birth of a new heir. His assassination was probably instigated by the mother of ALEXANDE, Olympias of EPIRUS, fearing this act, which allowed the latter to become the great conqueror of PERSIA after his victories against DARIUS III. Also the attempt of ACRISIOS against PERSEE, locked in a barrel with his mother DANAE, which was thrown into the sea. Without to forget the Gods in Greek antiquity, the murder of CESAR on the steps of

the Capitol and his last words to BRUTUS: "You too my son". In European history, we can still cite Ivan the Terrible or even the king of PRUSSIA, who executed the very close friend of the one, who would become FREDERIC II [1-3].

Conclusion

The development of this research will need to be pursued in a more exhaustive manner. We will conclude in a somewhat shortened manner on a new observation, which will require confirmation: with recent data from biologists, who have noted changes in gray matter of the parents, after the birth of a child and in the father, a small drop in testosterone production.
