Case Report

First reported by Stringer [1], Pete Throb Figure 1, a mid-teen from Oink Town, UK, presented with what we now know to be the world's largest pimple (acne vulgaris). 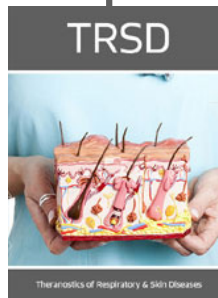
